

How Conservation Was 2020's Silver Lining WHEN A NATION UNDER LOCKDOWN TURNED TO THE OUTDOORS, THE TRCP WAS READY

IN MANY WAYS, THE THEODORE ROOSEVELT Conservation Partnership was humbled and fortunate to flourish in 2020, when so many Americans and their businesses were rocked by the economic downturn associated with the COVID-19 pandemic. Our team worked hard, made critical adjustments quickly, and took care of our families and each other, but we also benefited from what turned out to be the silver lining of a year marked by tragedy:

Americans flocked to nature—for respite, entertainment, and connection. This included many people who took up hunting and fishing for the very first time. As a result, conservation has become more important, and relevant to a broader audience, than ever.

This comes as no surprise to those of us who work in conservation every day. Even as our country seemed so deeply divided, and the continued ability of decision-makers to find common

we saw firsthand the continued ability of decision-makers to find common ground and pass legislation to improve fish and wildlife habitat, hunting and fishing access, and the outdoor recreation economy.

Conservation was a unifying force, and the TRCP and its partners are proud to have played a role in advancing solutions-oriented policy.

Among the many achievements that the TRCP celebrated last year (see p. 3) was passage of the groundbreaking Great American Outdoors Act and America's Conservation Enhancement Act, which made long awaited investments in our public lands and essential habitat programs. Our team partnered with an industry leader to continue identifying inaccessible public lands, this

time on half a million acres east of the Mississippi, and then worked with lawmakers to introduce legislation that would help fix this access challenge. Our coalition reformed menhaden management and took a first step toward reducing harvest of this critical forage fish in the Atlantic. We built a diverse coalition of groups aligned to combat climate change and launched a TV ad on FOX News calling on the Trump Administration to stop the Pebble Mine in Alaska, which was blocked one week later.

These efforts and many more will help guarantee all Americans quality places to hunt and fish in 2021 and beyond. But we couldn't have done this work without your help—thank you.

For nearly 20 years, the Theodore Roosevelt Conservation Partnership has brought people together, built coalitions, and advanced conservation. We hope this benefits you and your family in the same way that your ongoing support buoys our efforts.





The TRCP partnered with digital mapping company onX to release three reports detailing inaccessible public lands in nine states east of the Mississippi. This groundbreaking data builds on two previous reports which shine a light on the public access crisis in America. In total, the TRCP has detailed 16.43 million acres of landlocked public land in 22 states.



In 2020, **the TRCP** spent 80 percent of all contributions directly advancing conservation, keeping our overhead at a minimum.









Creating conservation jobs



With millions of Americans still out of work as a result of the pandemic, the TRCP is pushing decision-makers to craft economic recovery legislation that invests in conservation programs with a track record of creating jobs. Wetlands restoration and and coastal habitat improvements are among our specific recommendations.

Conserving migration corridors



Building on the momentum from recent executive orders on migration

corridor conservation and advances in GPS technology that allow us to know exactly where big game animals travel, the TRCP will continue to push for updates to federal land-use plans and policies that account for the importance of these seasonal habitats to elk, mule deer, and antelope.



Combatting chronic wasting disease



More than half the country has been touched by a wildlife disease that threatens the future of wild deer, hunt-

ing, and conservation funding—all while more people are newly interested in harvesting their own venison. In 2021, we are pushing for comprehensive legislation that funds strong state CWD response plans for better research, testing, and management.

Doubling conservation investments in the Farm Bill



The Farm Bill empowers farmers and family forest owners with the technical and financial assistance they need to enhance soil health, water quality, wildlife habitat, hunting and fishing access, and the land's ability to sequester carbon. The TRCP is laying the groundwork for doubling investment and growing enrollment in Farm Bill conservation programs in the next five-year bill.

Passing the MAPLand Act



The Modernizing Access to our Public Lands Act (see p. 3) has

already been reintroduced this Congress with strong bipartisan support. We'll be pushing to get it over the finish line so that hunters and anglers can confidently and responsibly plan their next public lands adventure.



Improving menhaden management in the Gulf





expanded its menhaden campaign from the Atlantic to the

Gulf, partnering with other leading voices in recreational fishing to urge fisheries managers to protect sensitive ecosystems from industrial fishing. In 2021, we will push for an ecological management model for menhaden and support state legislation that prioritizes menhaden conservation.



Advancing natural climate solutions



As we work with an administration eager to engage in the climate fight, the TRCP's focus will be ensuring hunters and anglers have a seat at the table and harnessing the power of natural systems—in other words, habitat—to remove and sequester carbon from the atmosphere. This approach will help build more resilient communities AND fish and wildlife populations.


